

Make A Wish



Supplies:

- **Stamps:** Little Lady, Chit Chat (Paper Smooches)
- **Ink:** Coffee Archival ink; Brushed Corduroy, Tattered Rose and Barn Door Distress inks (Ranger); White Poster Paint pen (Sharpie)
- **Paper:** Coffee CS (American Crafts); Sweet Day 6" x 6" paper pad (Echo Park); Painted Desert CS (Bazzill)
- **Accessories:** bone folder, sponge dauber, fabric scissors (Craft Store); paper scissors (Cutter Bee); Tombow Mono Multi Liquid Glue (Tombow); Die-namics Fishtail Flags Stax (My Favorite Things); Big Shot (Sizzix); Early Espresso baker's twine (Stampin' Up!); tape (Scotch); 3D Dots (EK Success); double sided adhesive, glue dots (thermo-web)

Dimensions:

- Painted Desert CS: a 4 ¼" x 11" piece
- Coffee CS: a scrap piece
- Sweet Day patterned paper: a 4" x 5 ¼" piece (large multi colored polka dot pattern), a 2 ½" x 5" piece (small polka dot pattern), a scrap piece (diagonal stripes) and a scrap piece (solid red)
- Early Espresso baker's twine: a 17" piece and a 10" piece

Directions:

1. Fold the 4 ¼" x 11" piece of Painted Desert CS in half, with a bone folder, creating a 4 ¼" x 5 ½" card base. Set aside for a moment.
2. Stamp the entire ice cream image onto a scrap piece of Coffee CS, using Coffee Archival ink. Cut out the entire ice cream, as close to the image as possible, using paper scissors.
3. Stamp the "ice cream" portion of the ice cream image onto a scrap piece of Sweet Day patterned paper (diagonal stripes), using Coffee Archival ink. Cut out the ice cream portion, as close to the image as possible, using paper scissors.
4. Stamp the "cherry" portion of the ice cream image onto a scrap piece of Sweet Day patterned paper (solid red), using Coffee Archival ink. Cut out the cherry portion, as close to the image as possible, using paper snips.
5. Sponge along the bottom edge and left hand edge of the cut out "cone" image, using a sponge dauber and Brushed Corduroy Distress ink.
6. Sponge along the bottom and the left hand side of the cut out "ice cream" image, using a sponge dauber and Tattered Rose Distress ink.
7. Sponge along the bottom and the left hand side of the cut out "cherry", using a sponge dauber and Barn Door Distress ink.
8. Stick the "ice cream" to the top of the "cone" using Tombow Mono Multi Liquid Glue. Stick the "cherry" to the top of the "ice cream", using Tombow Mono Multi Liquid Glue.
9. Add a highlight to the top of the cherry, using a White Poster Paint pen.
10. Center and stick the 4" x 5 ¼" piece of patterned paper to the folded card base, using double sided adhesive.

11. Die cut a flag from the 2 ½" x 5" piece of patterned paper (small polka dot pattern), using the Die-namics Fishtail Flags Stax and the Big Shot. The die will be longer than your piece of patterned paper – just make sure to position the die so that the fishtail portion is directly at the bottom of the patterned paper.
12. Lay the paper pieced ice cream cone on the bottom of the die cut flag for proper placement.
13. Stamp the greeting onto the die cut flag, just above the ice cream cone, using Coffee Archival ink.
14. Stick one end of the 17" piece of Early Espresso baker's twine to the back of the die cut flag, just above the greeting, using a piece of tape. Wrap the twine around the top of the die cut flag, three times and stick the end of the twine to the back of the die cut flag, using a piece of tape.
15. Stick the die cut flag to the card, aligning the top of the die cut flag with the top edge of the patterned paper and about ½" in from the right hand edge of the patterned paper, using 3D Dots.
16. Stick the paper pieced ice cream cone to the die cut flag, just below the greeting, using 3D Dots.
17. Feed a 10" piece of Early Espresso baker's twine down through a hole in a brown button, under the baker's twine wrapped around the die cut flag, and then up through the second button hole. With the ends even, tie the baker's twine into a bow on the front of the button. Trim the ends, if necessary, using fabric scissors.
18. Stick a glue dot to the back of the button and stick it to the card. You're done!
