

Nature's Discovery



Supplies:

- **Stamps:** Nature's Discoveries (Tim Holtz - Stamper's Anonymous); Through the Trees (papertrey ink)
- **Ink:** Early Espresso Classic ink, Daffodil Delight Classic ink (Stampin' Up!);
- **Paper:** Crumb Cake CS (Stampin' Up!); Java CS, Smooth Ivory CS (Bazzill)
- **Accessories:** bone folder, paper snips, 1 ½" Circle punch, 1 ¾" Circle punch, Stampin' Dimensionals (Stampin' Up!); Tape Runner XL (thermo-web)

Dimensions:

- Crumb Cake CS: a 6 ½" x 7" piece
- Java CS: a 3 ⅛" x 6 ⅛" piece and a scrap piece
- Smooth Ivory CS: a 3" x 6" piece and a scrap piece

Directions:

1. Fold the 6 ½" x 7" piece of Crumb Cake CS in half, with a bone folder, creating a 3 ½" x 6 ½" card base. Set this aside for a moment.
2. Stamp the floral image onto the bottom right hand corner of the 3" x 6" piece of Smooth Ivory CS, using Early Espresso Classic ink.
3. Stamp the two butterfly images onto a scrap piece of Smooth Ivory CS, using Daffodil Delight Classic ink.
4. Cut out the two butterfly images, leaving a small Ivory border around the image, using paper snips.
5. Stamp the floral image onto a scrap piece of Smooth Ivory CS, using Daffodil Delight Classic ink.
6. Stamp the greeting over a portion of the floral image on the scrap piece of Smooth Ivory CS, using Early Espresso Classic ink.
7. Center the greeting in the window of a 1 ½" Circle punch and punch it out.
8. Punch out a circle from a scrap piece of Java CS, using a 1 ¾" Circle punch.
9. Center and stick the punched out greeting to the Java CS circle, using Stampin' Dimensionals.
10. Center and stick the 3" x 6" piece of Smooth Ivory CS to the 3 ⅛" x 6 ⅛" piece of Java CS, using double sided adhesive.
11. Center and stick the matted 3" x 6" piece of Smooth Ivory CS to the card base, using Stampin' Dimensionals.
12. Stick the matted greeting to the card, aligning the Daffodil Delight stamped image on the greeting with the Early Espresso stamped image underneath, using Stampin' Dimensionals.
13. Stick the two cut out butterfly images to the card, using Stampin' Dimensionals. You're done!
